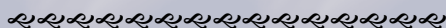
The system will go off-line as follows, so unfortunately it will not be possible to do any data entry between these times:

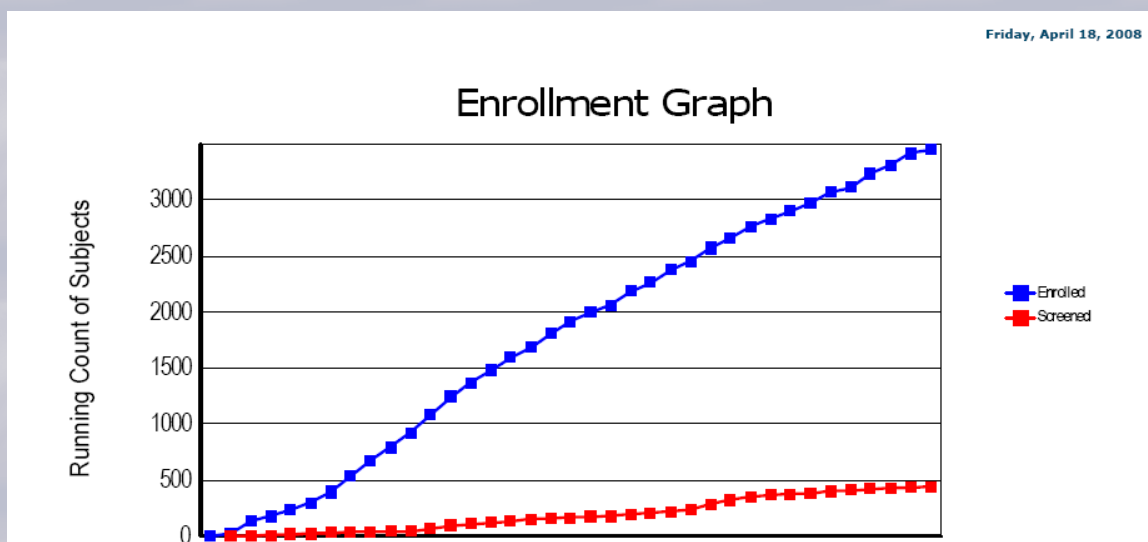
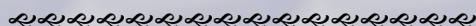


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We are currently updating appendices 1, 2 and 3, which concern all the Medidata information in the Investigator's file for the updated EDC, and we will be sending you the updated version soon.
